SEAMEO's Seven Priorities

- Priority 3: Resiliency in the face of disasters
 - Preparing schools leaders, teachers and students as well as local communities in managing and maintaining the delivery of education services
- Priority 7: Adopting a 21st century curriculum
 - Developing knowledge, skills, and values needed to respond to the changing global context
 - Developing teachers and learners with the ideals for building the ASEAN community



Global Citizenship

- The Covid 19 pandemic demonstrated the interrelated concerns and potentials across countries and societies
- The risks faced by vulnerable groups and resource limitations are underlined
- At the same time, the value of a whole community or whole nation approach as well as the potentials for collaborative work for solutions are also highlighted
- With the greatest disruption in education comes the drive to work together and learn from each other


