Global Health




- Worldwide improvement of health,

COVID-19 AND TRIAD OF GLOBAL UNIVERSAL VALUES



COVID-19 AND TRIAD OF GLOBAL UNIVERSAL VALUES









 defines "the degree to which individuals have the capacity to obtain, process, and understand basic health information needed to make appropriate health decisions.

 adequate health literacy may increase a person's capacity to take responsibility for their health and their family's health.

Indirect Impact On Other Diseases

• COVID-19 significantly impacts health services for non-communicable diseases and other communicable diseases.

• This situation is of significant concern because people living with NCDs are at higher risk of severe COVID-19-related illness and death.







Framing COVID-19 in GCED ...

- COVID-19 is an issue that extends the ideas of rights and responsibilities beyond the limits of one's local community
- In some instances, there's a surge in stigma, polarization, racism and hate speech against vulnerable communities
- GCED underscores the individual's responsibility arising from membership in a global community.



In the COVID-19 pandemic an example of one's responsibility to other peoples' health is the

issue of mask



Thus

it is most appropriate to frame COVID-19 within the framework of GCED which nurtures

shared values and responsibilities.

"Solidarity" clinical trial for COVID-19 treatments

Solidarity is an international clinical trial to help find an effective treatment for COVID-19, launched by the World Health Organization and partners. It is one of the largest international randomized trials for COVID-19 treatments, enrolling almost 12 000 patients in 500 hospital sites in over 30 countries.




